I have been ministering to junior high and high school students either through youth ministry or education for the past 28 years. Countless hours have been dedicated to my own personal education so I can more effectively meet the needs of today's youth. I have taught students science, mathematics, bible, physical education, language arts and history. I have coached hundreds of athletes to the point where I knew beyond the shadow of a doubt that they would make the final shot to win the game.

So, why is it that I have difficulty teaching my son science? Why is it that I have challenges getting my daughter up and ready for school in the morning? Why is it that when I step foot into my home I feel somewhat unprepared in spite of all my training and expertise? Oh yeah! I remember! I must transform into "dad." Being dad does not mean that I am inadequate or unprepared. Being dad simply means that my children know me better than I know myself. Schools can be run a particular way, but a home cannot be run like a school.

We, as parents, sometimes feel inadequate in the training of our children, but we are continually spurred on to supply their needs, to comfort their pain and to love them as they grow and develop. God has given us the tools that we need to raise our children and we learn by our mistakes and successes. We experience joy as we see our children succeed and we experience pain when we see our children hurt.

As a dad, I take on the responsibility of preparing my children for the times when I am not there. I won't be able to protect them at all times, but I can give them the tools



they need to make an appropriate choice when the time comes. Will they make the right choice? I don't know. But, have I prepared them to make the right choice? Yes, I have.

STANDARDIZED TESTS

Various student assessments are available throughout the school year at Valley Christian Junior High and High School. Because of the standardized nature of each of the examinations listed below, tests must be taken at the designated time and cannot be made up. When tests are scheduled to start at 8:00 AM, students are expected to report as usual to their homerooms at 7:50 AM for attendance.

8th grade students took the Explore test on September 28. That test is an introduction to the ACT college admission test and measures student knowledge and skills in preparation for high school. Juniors recently took the PSAT on October 13. That test serves as official practice for the SAT and to determine eligibility for some national scholarships, such as National Merit Competition

Tests scheduled for the remainder of the year are:

PLAN TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 8, 2011 8:00 AM - 11:30 AM

 WHO: Sophomores

This test is the official preliminary predictor of ACT scores and assesses a student's mastery of core curriculum. In addition, this test measures aptitude and career interest.

STANFORD 10 ACHIEVEMENT TEST MONDAY - WEDNESDAY APRIL 11-13, 2011
 COST: none
 PLACE: Classrooms
 WHO: Students in Grade 6 & 8

This test should not be confused with the SAT college entrance exams. The Stanford Achievement Test is used to assess the growth of students from academic year to academic year. It is valuable in assessing not only student development, but the effectiveness of the curriculum as well.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMS MONDAY - FRIDAY MAY 3 - 12, 2011
 8:00 AM - 5:00 PM (Each individual subject test takes approximately four hours.)
 COST: \$87.00 per subject test
 PLACE: Fireside Room (or designated classrooms)
 WHO: Students who have taken Advanced Placement courses

Several benefits for students to take AP Exams are the challenge, the sense of accomplishment, the strengthening of college and scholarship applications, and time and money saved for college. A student who scores 3 or better on an AP exam is generally considered qualified to receive credit for the equivalent course at one of the 2,900 colleges and universities that give credit for AP Exams.

Registration for Advanced Placement Exams is included in the fee for the related AP course offered at VCHS. All fees must be paid before tests are administered. The school must order and pay for the exams in advance, therefore, no refunds can be made.

High School From the Academic Advisors

“Its so hard! Is it worth it? What about my GPA?” | We all know that learning at an early age to work hard and to persist in working hard makes the hard work we have to do when we are older seem less difficult. Thomas Edison put it another way: “Opportunity is missed by most people because it is dressed in overalls and looks like work”.

1. What is the value of an Advanced Placement course? | Courses at Valley Christian Junior High and High School are organized in the areas of content and skill so that each grade level challenges students incrementally in order to equip them to select an Advanced Placement course in their junior or senior year.

Preparing students for college prior to graduation from high school is critical to students’ completing a college degree. Most college students who take remedial courses fail to earn a bachelor’s degree (Adelman, 2004).

90% of the colleges and universities in the US, as well as colleges and universities in more than 40 countries, grant students credit units or advance placement. This means that some colleges award college credit so that you actually earn credit units toward a college degree. Other colleges award advanced enrollment status, meaning that a student can skip introductory courses and enter higher-level courses, or fulfill general education requirements.

2. Is there value in taking only one AP course before graduation? | Yes. When colleges look at your transcript seeing that you have selected a course that is more rigorous than you needed for graduation, it shows your desire to work at the college level which helps to demonstrate your readiness for college admission. A course such as AP English Language and Composition in particular is an important choice because it prepares you for the kind of reading and writing that you will have in college.

3. What is the value of taking more than two AP courses in one year? | Certainly taking multiple AP courses can demonstrate your readiness for college admission. However, many colleges only allow you to calculate two AP courses for weighted grades when figuring GPA. More importantly, you must consider that the commitment to such courses is serious, requiring significant hours of work. It is more significant to be successful in the AP courses you take than to enroll in many of them.

4. What if my GPA is adversely affected by taking these hard classes? | If you earn a C or above in an AP course the grade is weighted, meaning a C is worth 3 GPA points, not 2; and a B is worth 4 GPA points; and an A is worth 5 GPA points. The fact that you have selected a more rigorous academic path is more valuable than if you had not. However, correct placement is important. A grade of D in an AP course is not weighted. Any D grade communicates a lack of basic proficiency in a course.

5. What is the value of the AP exam? | The exam validates the knowledge you have mastered and your ability to think flexibly and accurately under pressure.

6. What if I don’t pass the AP exam? | Colleges value students that have taken the AP class and earned a C or above even if you don’t pass the exam. The fact that you took the course communicates positively to admissions while you don’t earn college credit.

7. How can I prepare for AP if I am in junior high school? Learn good study habits; improve your reading and writing skills.

8. What if I have not worked hard in school prior to now, but I want to do well in college. Is it too late to take AP? | Set a plan for improving your skills so that you can take AP English Language and Composition in either your junior or senior year of high school.

Commended Student in the 2011 National Merit Scholarship Program

Principal Larry Lopez announced that senior Andrew Tai has been named a Commended Scholar in the 2011 National Merit Scholarship Program. About 34,000 Commended Students are being recognized throughout the nation for their exceptional academic promise. Although he will not continue in the 2011 competition for National Merit Scholarships, Andrew placed among the top 5% of more than 1.5 million students who entered the 2011 competition by taking the PSAT.

"Recognition of high-achieving students is essential to advancing educational excellence in our nation," commented a spokesperson for NMSC. "As demonstrated by their outstanding performance in our highly competitive program, the young men and women named Commended Scholars represent some of the most academically talented students in our country. We sincerely hope this recognition will enhance their educational opportunities and encourage them in their pursuit of academic success."

Sadie Hawkins | The Sadie Hawkins dance will be just around the corner on Dec. 3.

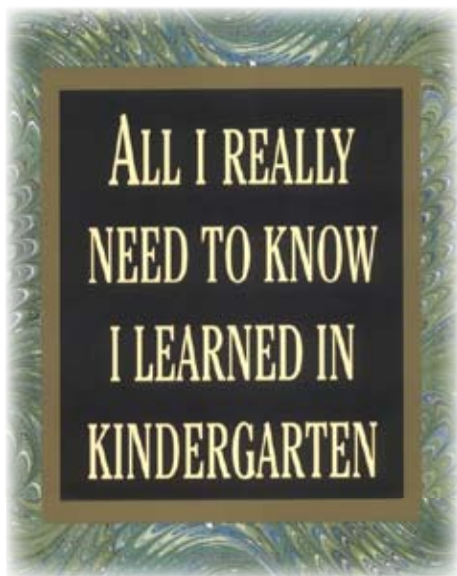


Host Families Wanted
