I WILL ASK FOR FORGIVENESS LESSON FIVE

BIBLE STORY:

During this week, take time to read the Story of the Prodigal Son in Luke 15:11-24. At the end of the story have your children cheer for the son who returned home and asked for forgiveness..

MAIN POINT:

I Will Ask For Forgiveness.

ACTIVITY 1 - FORGIVENESS GAME

This week, play one of your children's board games with them. If someone messes up and loses a turn or gets out of the game, give them a chance to redeem themselves by asking for forgiveness. When they ask for forgiveness, have the rest of the family say that they will forgive them and they can come back in the game.

ACTIVITY 2 - THE SENSES

Read Luke 15:11-24. As you read the story, have your children think of all the things that the son saw, smelled, touched, and felt as he went through this journey from home to the high life, to the pig pen, and back home again. Talk about how the son must have seen and felt things that he never had seen or felt before – especially when it came time for him to ask for forgiveness from his father. Remind them that God wants us to ask for forgiveness when we do something wrong or mess up.
