Seniors: The Holiday Rush

The only group more stressed than College Admissions Counselors in December is the group of high school seniors applying for “early action” or “early decision”. Many colleges announce their selections by the last week in December. A number of students will receive letters of acceptance, while others may receive deferrals, a missive that can elicit both pain and hope. Even harsher to receive are rejection letters.

Early action or early decision is a wonderful option for the student who has fallen in love with a specific school. Since we never know if love will be requited until that acceptance letter arrives, it is always a risk to apply early. At regular decision time, many letters from colleges appear in the mailbox. Some are terrific, some less so, but there is usually a balance of good and bad. There is also a larger peer group that helps you understand who got in and who did not. Early notifications, however, stand alone. If you are accepted, you can “breathe easy” for the rest of senior year, although you must keep your grades at a reasonable level.

By the way, it is perfectly acceptable to call admissions offices and ask when they plan to mail their letters or when they

will release their decisions online. That will save you from having to camp out by the mailbox or computer. In fact, because of problems with mail delivery, many schools now tell early applicants that decisions will be available at a specific time and place online.

Since scores have to be reported to colleges in time for consideration by admissions officers, the December SAT, ACT, and SAT Subject Tests probably represent your last opportunity to enjoy the pleasures of standardized testing before you leave high school to begin your undergraduate career. It’s also a critical time for preparing financial aid statements, due right after January 1st.

All applications with January deadlines should be completed and submitted by December, and any recommendations and school report forms should have been submitted to the counseling office. You should also have met with a guidance counselor to finalize what will be included in your personal recommendation. Make sure to give the guidance counselor a copy of your pre-college activities resume so that your school-wide activities can be mentioned in the recommendation.

From the Academic Advisors

False Rumors and Bad Advice

- Only a few universities accept the ACT exam.
- The first year of high school doesn't "count" since no college looks at grades earned in ninth grade.
- Colleges that cost more always offer a higher quality education.
- Competitive colleges no longer offer credit for AP scores.
- It always costs more to go to a private college than to a public college.
- All valedictorians are assured admission to the university of their choice.
- Take college prep courses early and make sure to have an easy course load as a senior.
- It's OK to drop courses mid-senior year after you've received college acceptance notices.
- It is the responsibility of the high school counselor to select your courses and monitor your college eligibility.
- Take the easiest classes to keep your GPA high.

All the previous statements are false. So make sure you get the right information from someone who knows!



College Scholarship Sources

- Colleges - universities offer merit scholarships for academic promise, specific talent, or athletics.
- Corporations - local and national businesses grant scholarships. Check out the websites of national companies to see what awards they offer.
- Community Clubs and Groups - local civic groups such as the Rotary Club often post scholarships at the high school counseling office.
- Religious Community - churches and other places of worship offer scholarships.
- Minority Organizations – particular groups offer aid based on race, gender or ethnicity.
- Your Parent's Employer or Union.

COLLEGE PREP-101

Junior Year Checklist – Valley Christian High School

Your High School Transcript

This year's academic record will go a long way toward either helping or hurting your chances of gaining admission to the college of your choice. You can make up ground if you've been slacking, and you can keep up the hard work you've already exhibited.

- Review your transcript.
- Report any omissions or corrections to the registrar or a counselor.
- Compute your "academic GPA" and enter it here: _____
- Set goals for junior year GPA: Semester 1 _____ Semester 2 _____

College Admission Testing

- Attend the ACT/SAT testing workshop presented by the PTF in September.
- Take the PSAT in October.
- Review your PLAN and PSAT scores with a counselor.
- Register for the ACT Achievement Test and/or SAT Reasoning test online at www.actstudent.org or www.collegeboard.com.

Take the ACT and/or SAT during the spring semester. That way you'll have at least one score going into your senior year. This also puts you on college mailing lists and gives significant information to the schools you are considering.

⇒ **Strategy:** Don't take the ACT or SAT too often. Scores may improve with the second or third tests and then go down.

College & Scholarship Search

Talk to friends and family to gather ideas on colleges. Begin researching possible colleges and request or download information from them. Bookmark these search tools:

- www.Naviance.com
- www.MyCollegeQuickstart.com

Using Naviance, develop a college file to store information about colleges and scholarships, recommendations, your lists of awards and activities, etc.

Get to know the admission criteria and the “freshman profile” for your top schools. Know where you stand in relation to those requirements and statistics and work toward changing what you can if you fall short. Ask your high school counselor for suggestions as to colleges you should consider but might not have thought of on your own.

⇒**Strategy:** Volunteer to help someone a year older than you locate scholarship information with the understanding that you’ll get all their information when they’re through.

College Visits

- Visit college campuses when school is in session, especially on Preview Days.

⇒**Strategy:** Attend events on college campuses (plays, concerts, sporting events, activities related to your major, etc.).

College Applications

You will apply to colleges in the Fall of your senior year. However, you can begin preparation earlier than September of your senior year.

- Identify two adults - teachers, coaches, or pastors - who will write letters of recommendation for you.

⇒**Strategy:** Over the summer, begin writing practice essays and rough drafts of college applications. Ask friends and family to critique your essays.

Extracurricular Activities

Get involved in extracurricular activities and volunteer in your community. Choose activities that matter to you and develop your gifts and talents.

- Volunteer to lead a project or activity.
- Run for leadership positions in the organizations you are involved in.
- Find your niche and commit to a program or “cause”.

⇒**Strategy:** Create and routinely update a record of your activities and service. At the start of your senior year, provide a copy of your record to your counselor.

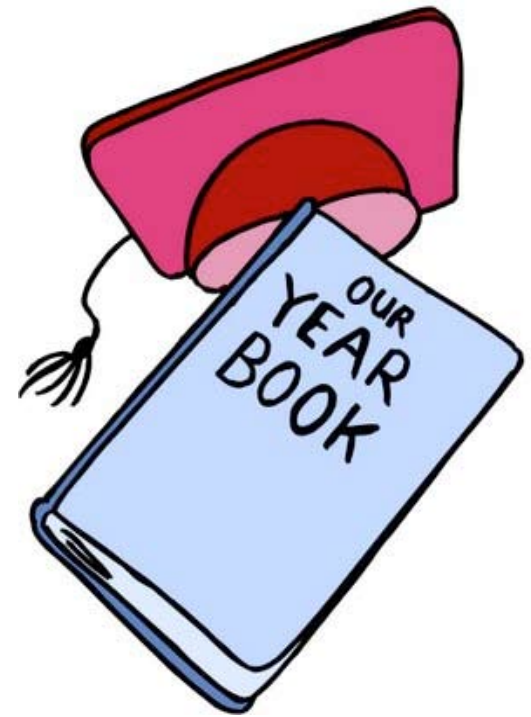
